# **Happy Hat**

## adjustments for larger sizes in parenthesis

## materials & gauge:

dpns or circular needles – 3.25mm (us 3) and 3.75mm (us 5)
or size necessary to achieve gauge

OK weight yarn:

preemie small/medium: MC: 80 yards/CC: 20 yards

preemie large:

MC: 90 yards/CC: 20 yards

newborn:

MC: 100 yards/CC: 20 yards

p2tog: purl 2 sts together as one

gauge: 24 st/29 r = 4" in stockinette w/larger needles

all yarn requirements are approximate

### abbreviations:

k: knit

p: purl

MC: main color sl X: slip X sts, purlwise and with yarn in back, unless otherwise

noted

skp: slip 1, knit 1, pass slipped st

over knit st st(s): stitch(es)

rnd(s): round(s)



#### instructions:

with MC, cast on 66 (72/78). if making ribbed edge use smaller needles. join into a circle, being careful not to twist.

#### for rolled brim -

10(9/8) rnds: k around

#### for ribbed edge -

8(8/8) rnds: k2, p1 around

#### crown:

- © 4(5/6) rnds: k around
- 18 rnds: work in stockinette using your favourite intarsia-in-the-round method to make the color changes according to the chart.
  - odd numbered rows will be knit, even rows will be purled
- © 3(5/6) rnds: k around

#### decreases:

- 1: \*skp, k9(10/11) repeat from \* around
- 2: \*skp, k8(9/10) repeat from \* around
- 3: \*skp, k7(8/9) repeat from \* around
- 4: \*skp, k6(7/8) repeat from \* around
- 5: \*skp, k5(6/7) repeat from \* around
- 6: \*skp, k4(5/6) repeat from \* around
- 7: \*skp, k3(4/5) repeat from \* around
- 8: \*skp, k2(3/4) repeat from \* around
- 9: \*skp, k1(2/3) repeat from \* around
- 10: \*skp, k -(1/2) repeat from \* around (last rnd for size small/med 6 sts)
- 11: \*skp, k -(-/1) repeat from \* around (last rnd for size large 6 sts)
- 12: \*skp repeat from \* around (last rnd for newborn 6 sts)

# finishing:

- clip yarn leaving 6" tail. draw tail through loops
- ie off. weave in ends.
- add the topper of your choice -- shown with a loopy topper


# DESIGNER'S NOTES:

consider working the black stitches afterward using a duplicate stitch or by cross stitching them, using the chart for placement

for a little extra fun, cast on using both colors
